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River Community Church Bible Reading Plan

A Redemptive-Historical Reading Plan

This year at River, we are going to work on a different sort of Bible reading plan together. We will still retain the basic five-day schedule (with some optional weekend Psalms). However, rather than squeeze the entire Bible into one year, we are going to read the Bible in a way that helps us connect the dots with the Bible's overarching story and structure. The current plan features 48 weeks of readings, allowing for a month for Christmas readings or one read-through of Proverbs.

The basic structure of the reading plan this year comes from Greg Lanier (glanier.wordpress.com) and his book Old Made New: A Guide to the New Testament Use of the Old Testament. We have reframed his plan into a weekly structure and thrown in some of our own Biblical-Theological connections to flesh out his basic outline.

The purpose of this year's plan is to help Bible readers grasp the flow of Redemptive History (the overarching story of the Bible; how God has worked in history to bring about his plan of salvation). Old Testament readings will be paired with New Testament readings that shed light on one another, ultimately revealing Christ's personal and final fulfillment of Old Testament promises.

There will be some key passages which will be repeated multiple times in this plan. This is because their importance, trajectory, and fulfillment are expansive. Each time you return to such a passage, try to slow down and read it again with fresh eyes. As we are reading a plan that encourages theological connections, feel free to take your time, re-read, and dwell on things.
